We understand that everyone is on their own personal archery journey, and we need to ensure that our underpinning role is one of support to those archers, volunteers and participants. By supporting our community, we will give everyone the opportunity to participate, progress, and achieve.

All our work so far and over the next four years will be made possible by our volunteers, coaches, judges, archery families, and staff team who all dedicate their time to our sport. We, as Scottish Archery, are focused on our role over the next four years—to support our archery community.

This new strategy ensures longevity of archery as an inclusive and sustainable sport, a sport where lifelong participation is promoted, and a sport where people feel a sense of belonging.

We understand that archery activity is built on a strong system and recognise that we need to refocus on the foundations of our infrastructure. We also understand the importance of being innovative with our programmes to keep up with the everchanging dynamics of society.

Supporting our fantastic people and widening our connections to advocate for our sport will be vital for growth and development. Our plans will include regular reviews to evolve what we do to ensure continuous improvement. Our members will be with us on the journey.
